## Seventy-ninth session Agenda item: Moratorium on the execution of the death penalty

## Moratorium on the use of the death penalty

The General Assembly,

Recognizing that the death penalty is a human right invasion,

Concerning strongly about the irreversibility of the death penalty,

Recognizing the importance of the offender"s right to a fair trial,

Recognizing that human rights should not be violated by state,

Recognizing the importance of minimum standards,

Emphasizing the importance of having chances to seek pardon,

- 1. Believing in respecting human rights and guarantee to the right to life for all
- 2. *Recognizing* that the death penalty undermines human dignity,
- 3. Taking note that wrongful convictions are irreversible,
- 4. Affirming that every human being if born with basic human rights,
- 5. *Emphasizing* in abolishing the death penalty in all states,
- 6. *Request* each country to report their number of death penalties and how they have been executed each year,
- 7. *Taking into consideration* that rehabilitation and education are alternative to the death penalty;

- a. to implement education by non-profit organizations to spread awareness and to promote abolition of the death penalty,
- 8. Stresses that human dignity should not be violated by the state,
- 9. Reaffirming that the state should take the initiative to abolish,
- 10. Recommends all UN member states to adopt a dual review system to improve the transparency of trials and prevent wrongful convictions,
- 11. Recommends all UN member states to follow the minimum standards
