

JEIMUN2026 Position and Policy Paper

PPP (Position and Policy Paper) is a document in which you organize the research you have conducted and the ideas you have developed during the preparation phase of the conference.

It is considered one of the tools for **dialogue between the JEIMUN2026 staff and delegates**. By reviewing your PPP in advance, the JEIMUN2026 staff can better understand your perspectives and make preparations to ensure smoother proceedings and a more productive conference.

At the same time, PPP is also regarded as a tool for **dialogue among delegates**. By reading each country's Statement Paper, delegates can carefully review and understand the positions of other countries beforehand, which enables more efficient and substantive discussions during the conference.

As JEIMUN2026 considers the PPP to be an integral part of communication, **all delegates are required to submit it before the conference**, even if they were unable to meet the official deadline.

1. Based on your country's analysis of the current situation and vision of an ideal world, summarize your national policy in **no more than 300 words**.
(Not to be shared among delegates)
2. Based on Question 1, write a Statement Paper to be shared with other countries in **no more than 200 words**.
(To be shared among delegates)
3. Explain what kind of actions you would take during the conference and what strategies you would adopt in order to realize your country's vision of an ideal world.
(Optional, no word limit, you can upload images)
4. List your references.
(Include all sources you referred to when completing the PPP and worksheet.)
5. If you used any generative AI tools in the process of creating your PPP, specify which tools you used and describe the prompts or questions you provided to them.

Important Notes

- **One country should submit one PPP.**
- **The answers for Question 1 and 2 must be written in English.**
- **Please strictly observe the word limit (especially for Question 2).**
Any submission exceeding **200 words** will be **deleted**.
- **Deadline: December 28 23:59:59 JST.**
- Even if you miss the deadline, the submission form will remain open.
Make sure to submit your PPP.

Advice (Guidelines for Making Policies)

The following may not always be correct answers, but reflects the expectations and assumptions of the executive members of JEIMUN2026.

A) Positioning of the Statement Paper

This Statement Paper will be shared **only with all delegates and the JEIMUN2026 staff members prior to the session**, and therefore serves as a means of information-sharing exclusively within the committee. It will **not** be made public worldwide.

(This differs from a *Formal Speech*, which is intended for public disclosure.)

The purpose of the Statement Paper is to improve the efficiency of discussions on the conference day by allowing participants to share their policies in advance.

Accordingly, delegates are expected to **clearly and logically** explain both their policies and the reasons for proposing them.

B) What is Policy?

How are policies formulated? There are three main steps in policy-making:

1. **Analyzing the current situation**
2. **Constructing a vision of the ideal world**
3. **Identifying what actions must be taken to move from the current situation to the ideal one**

※Steps 1 and 2 may be reversed.

Policies are formulated through these three steps. Steps 1 and 2 may together be described as the **“reasoning.”** Analyzing the current situation helps you understand **why you are going to discuss the agenda at the United Nations**, while constructing an ideal vision helps you evaluate **whether your policy is meaningful and coherent**.

You are encouraged to keep these three elements in mind when making your policy.
